



Welcome to my monthly Partnership Funded PCSO report for Dec 2019

UPDATES:

Rushmere St Andrew –

I am pleased to report the crime figures remain low in RSA. I have been made aware of ASB issues that are occurring in Kelvedon Drive and both East and Woodbridge SNT have been notified to patrol the areas when possible. With this said I would like to encourage that residents do call in at the time any ASB is occurring in order to stand a better chance of catching the group and therefore assess if any crimes are being committed and take appropriate action.

I understand that many people are reporting frustrations when calling 101 due to being left on hold for long periods of time. If this is not a suitable avenue please bear in mind that you can visit the Constabulary Website to make an online report.

101 or the online reporting is suitable if ASB or a crime is physically taking place or has taken place. If your report is simply drug related litter finds, this would not necessarily need to be reported in this manner as it is not actionable information, However, if necessary this could be emailed to me just so we can monitor that activity is continuing.

Lastly, please do not feel disheartened if you do make a call and you do not physically see a unit arrive in the area. As you will appreciate every job is prioritised and placed in a queue so it will simply depend on staff numbers and how many other events are occurring at the time. If an officer is not dispatched at the time then the report will be passed to the SNT and dealt with by us. Depending on the nature of the call, it may be that an intelligence report is submitted or where the caller states they want a phone call or visit from an officer this will also be facilitated. All calls will mean that we can monitor and assess how big a problematic area is, we can check patterns in times and dates in order to target our patrols and submitting intelligence helps us to build a bigger picture and establish any links to wider crime.
