



Welcome to my monthly Partnership Funded PCSO report for Oct 2019

UPDATES:

As you may now be aware I have been offered a permanent position as an EAST SNT Link PCSO and therefore you will be receiving a replacement funded PCSO in the upcoming weeks/months. I am extremely pleased that I am still covering the East of Ipswich and can still offer support to your parishes.

RUSHMERE HEATH –

As you will see from the stats we have recorded an ASB investigation following a call from a member of public reporting youths using the area of the Heath close to linksfield to gather and use substances often including the nitrogen canisters. Due to this behaviour occurring in the evenings Woodbridge SNT have been very supportive in conducting patrols and will continue with this. We keep a log of patrols and any finds etc so I can monitor this and provide you with any forthcoming results if we encounter the youths.

BROKE HALL PRIMARY SCHOOL

Boke Hall have reported to me that on Tuesday's coaches returning to the school following swimming lessons are having issues manoeuvring around the estate due to double parked cars on Claverton Way. As you will be aware a portion of this road is not protected by lines and therefore double parking is difficult to enforce. To show the school and coach driver support I attended and put cones along one side of Claverton way to restrict parking in order for the Coach to pass. This worked well and the driver was very happy to be able to pass easily however this is not a long-term solution so the school are looking at potentially adjusting swimming times and speaking to highways about the possibility of a single yellow line being put down at least one side of the road to help alleviate this issue. I welcome any comments of ideas if this has previously been explored.

ANIT SOCIAL USE OF MOPEDS IN THE KESGRAVE AREA. –

The latest report for this has been that the youths are using the green space area at the rear of the Farmhouse PH. Again, officers are updated of locations and endeavour to Patrol the area.
